



**Today, on this Summer Monday:  
Jesus said, "I AM the MESSIAH"**

**Gather your children together and read John 4:25-26:**

**"The woman said, "I know the Messiah is coming—the one who is called Christ. When he comes, he will explain everything to us." Then Jesus told her, "I AM the MESSIAH!"**

**Application: We know that God looks into each person's heart. He knows everything about us, what we have done, what we have thought, what we will do and think. I love hearing the stories our daughter, and our daughter-in-love share with me about the times when their precious ones choose not to tell the truth or the whole truth. Although they cannot look into their child's heart, each child has their own 'subtle signs' which clearly indicate their transgression. Some fidget, some shuffle their feet, some refuse to make eye contact. . . you know. . .**

**We saw yesterday that GOD. . . I AM introduced Himself to Moses. . . HE wants to be known!**

**In John chapter 4, we are told that Jesus sat with a Samaritan woman in her village, at a well, and began to speak with her, and to tell her all the things about her life, and all about her mistakes. And she wondered how He knew?**

**Then, Jesus offered her a Hope and Truth and Love she had never known. Jesus, after seeing into her heart, knowing her and understanding her needs, identified and introduced Himself to her, "I AM the MESSIAH". She believed Him and we are told that many Samaritans believed in Jesus because of the woman's faith. They said, "He is Savior of the World!"**

**Discuss with your precious ones and remind them that Jesus knows our mistakes, and the things we do on purpose, knowing they are wrong, even when we keep them a secret. He also knows our hurts and our needs, and He loves each one of us. He came to earth so we would know God. . . I AM.**

**Jesus said, "I AM the MESSIAH". Messiah is the name which means "Anointed One" . . . or one who is set apart to do the job of God, to be the Deliverer, the Redeemer, the Savior. He wants us to tell Him the truth about our mistakes, even though He already knows. . . to be sorry for them, and to believe that He is our Savior. He loves us in spite of our mistakes and He forgives! Always! Always! Always!**
